Atlanta Dance Theatre's Captivating Performances Promise Something for Everyone

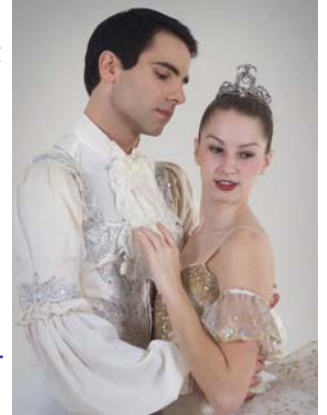

Going to eight classes a week plus rehearsals are just a part of Jenny's busy life, wearing out 2 pairs of pointe shoes a month. Of all of the classes Jenny takes ballet is her favorite. So much so that she plans to pursue dancing in college. "I'd love to attend a school with a really good ballet program, like Indiana University, and double major in dance and journalism," she said. As for Jenny's role model? "I love Julie Kent, the principal dancer in American Ballet Theatre. She seems nice and she's amazing to watch. She has more than technique. She has passion." Dancing the part of Raggedy Andy was Jenny's favorite role in *Babes In Toyland* and she is really looking forward to being the 'White Cat' in *Sleeping Beauty*, part of ADT's *Fairytale Favorites* performance next March. Last summer Jenny attended 8 weeks of intensive ballet camps; 3 weeks at ADT, 3 weeks at Metropolitan Ballet Theatre and 2 weeks at The Joffrey Ballet. At school Jenny is the features editor of her school newspaper.
